

Scholarship Awards:

- Rodeo Queen - \$1000
- First Princess - \$600
- Second Princess - \$400
- Winner of each area of competition will receive a Special Award
- Additional awards will be given to Miss Photogenic and Miss Congeniality
- Recipients have one year to redeem their scholarship following their High School Graduation

General Information

The Calaveras Rodeo Queen Competition seeks versatile young women who are intelligent, articulate, charming, talented, sincere, and healthy (in mind and body) with warm and outgoing personalities. The Calaveras Rodeo Queen and her court will serve as a role model for young women in our community and will reign for 1 calendar year representing Calaveras County Fair and the Jumping Frog Jubilee. Contestants entering the Calaveras Rodeo Queen Competition may be sponsored. The sponsorship dollars are to cover expenses associated with the competition. Any young lady that would love to represent our Calaveras County Fair and Jumping Frog Jubilee and community, as well as meet all the requirements of the title, is welcome to compete in our contest.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Between 14 and 19 years of age
2. In good health, never married, pregnant, or had a child
3. Must not be living with a male in lieu of marriage
4. Never been convicted of a criminal offense
5. Must be in good academic standing, with a verified cumulative 2.0 GPA or better
6. No body piercing elements or tattoos may be visible
7. Appropriate attire at all times while as a contestant and during reign (see rules and regulations).

8. You must be committed to making public appearances at public events. If you think that you will not be able to do this then you should not run. The best part of being Calaveras Rodeo Queen or a Princess is donating your time to the community.

Please note: These eligibility requirements apply during your reign as Calaveras Rodeo Queen or Princess, as well as your time as a contestant. Violation of the above eligibility requirements will be considered as cause for dismissal and loss of title and scholarship.

Entry Requirements:

Each contestant must submit the following with a completed application and the following documents at orientation

- a. A signed Release, Waiver, and Hold Harmless Agreement
- b. A signed Rules and Regulations document
- c. Verification of academic standing and cumulative GPA
- d. Signed Code of Conduct
- e. Social Media Policy Agreement

Entrant's Commitment:

Each contestant agrees that if she is the winner of the competition or a princess, she will be available for public appearances throughout the year. If you feel that you cannot keep this commitment, then you should not be running for Calaveras Rodeo Queen, as your main duty is to attend events in the county throughout the year of your reign. A tentative schedule will be given out at orientation.

Attendance:

Attendance is mandatory at all practices and events listed above. In the Attendance Category there are 100 points reserved to reflect your attendance. You get all 100 of these points by attending every event and by showing up on time. If you do not show up for an event you will receive 0 attendance points for that event. If you show up late you will receive half of the attendance points for that event. Example: If there are 10 points possible for an event you can receive 5 points for attending and 5 points for arriving on time.

Title Holders:

Contestants holding a current title cannot be introduced as such and cannot wear their title's attire (crown & sash). While representing the Calaveras Rodeo Queen and her court are under the jurisdiction of the Calaveras County Fair:

- While at and going to the Calaveras County Fair and Jumping Frog Jubilee
- Going to and attending Fair sponsored events
- Going to and attending special events as Calaveras Rodeo Queen (ex; Parades, rodeos, public events, etc.)

Further, you are reminded that during the course of the year, even you are not officially representing the Fair or the Calaveras Rodeo Queen Competition, you are expected to behave in a way that always reflects favorably upon your position and the Fair's.

Calaveras Rodeo Queen and her Court serve as representatives of the Fair and Calaveras County and are expected to behave discretely, being careful not to embarrass themselves or others with their behavior during the four days of the Fair and all official appearances as a Calaveras Rodeo Queen Court Member. Friends will not be allowed to accompany Rodeo Queen or her Court during the Fair, nor may they accompany Rodeo Queen and her Court members during functions they are attending as Calaveras Rodeo Queen Court members (parades, events, etc.) you are the official Fair representatives.

You will be very busy attending events throughout the four days of the Fair. When attending events as a Rodeo Queen Court member your focus needs to be on your community and your role as an ambassador for the Fair. Your boyfriend and/or other friends need to be aware of this and understand that the nature and scope of your responsibilities will severely limit the amount of time you can spend with them.

Cause for Dismissal – Loss of Title

The following behaviors are expressly forbidden and will be considered grounds for losing the title of Rodeo Queen or Princess.

Be proven to be:

- **In possession of and/or under the influence of any controlled substance, an alcoholic beverage, or intoxicant of any kind**
- **In possession of and/or use of tobacco, including but not limited to: cigarettes, cigars, smokeless tobacco, miniature cigarettes, etc.**
- **In possession, for use or sale, of illegal drugs, inhalants, or any other mood-altering substance not prescribed by your physician**
- **The use of vulgar language or profanity while appearing in public as either Rodeo Queen or a member of the Court**
- **Breach of Rodeo Queen Application**
- **Breach of Rules and Regulations**
- **Not meeting the general eligibility requirements**
- **Inappropriate, vulgar, illegal or in poor taste images and or messaging on social media.**

Appearance Guidelines

Things to Keep in mind

- Hat (and one day crown), sash, and buckle! Don't forget them
- Unmistakable as a cowgirl
 - This is absolutely key when you start looking into western trendy outfits, the line between appropriate and inappropriate is this simple rule
- Clean and shaped hat
- Complimentary jewelry
- Sash pinned non distractingly and not damaging valuable clothing (I recommend a magnet)
- Shirts should not be wrinkled
- Pick a belt that does not cut you in half
- Clean overall appearance
- Hair and makeup done well
- Good posture
- Outfits that look good and flow all together
- You want your outfit to help your confidence

Wardrobe Key:

This is a recommendation for wardrobe at the various saddle queen events. The only REQUIRED outfits are during competition which would be during speech, interview, impromptu question, and horsemanship. That is during speech, interview, and impromptu question you are to dress western trendy and during horsemanship you are to wear jeans with a solid colored snap/button up shirt.

Wrangler*- Wranglers, button up long sleeve shirt, Vest or Jacket Optional

Wrangler* *- Wranglers, button up long sleeve shirt. (No vests or jackets needed)

*horsemanship competition day is just a plain snap/button up, no vests/jackets

Rodeo/ Grand Entry – Wranglers, long sleeve shirt and vest or long sleeve shirt

Western Trendy - A look that blends Western Heritage with your own style and today's trends. The look is unmistakably Western, but unique and fashionable as well.

Practices – at riding practices you are not required at all to come in queen attire, just come on time & ready to ride

Point Break Down

This is the point break down presented to each judge for each category they are judging

This pageant will be broken up into 5 portions/categories. There are 1000 points possible multiplied by the judges for a grand total of 3000 points.

1. Interview
 - a. 200 possible points
 - b. Afternoon of May 4th
2. Speech
 - a. 200 possible points
3. Written Test
 - a. 50 possible points
 - b. Fill in the blank
4. Appearance
 - a. 200 possible points
 - i. For showing up (we understand that you may have some other unwavering commitments between school, sports, and family. Its ok if you miss an event but it will come at a cost to the contest)
 - ii. For being on time (10 mins early is on time, 5 mins early is late, and on time is left behind)
 - iii. For being dressed appropriately
 1. At every event (besides riding practices) you are expected to be dressed in event appropriate queen ready attire. Pictures will be taken, and those pictures will be submitted to the judges so that they can judge your outfit choice for this portion of the pageant.
5. Horsemanship
 - a. 350 total points possible
 - b. Broken down into
 - i. Pattern
 1. 150 points possible
 - ii. Rail Work
 1. 100 points possible
 - iii. Flag Run
 1. 50 points possible
 - iv. Queen Run
 1. 50 points possible

Social Media Policy

As our Operation continues to grow and social media use continues to increase among our target audience, it is important that we are unified in our approach and on the same page about what is expected of you as a participant and or volunteer of the Calaveras County Fairgrounds.

SHOULD I TALK ABOUT CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION ONLINE?

No. If a strategy, product, number, forecast, merger, acquisition, promotion, relocation, or any other internal information is not public you should not be talking, posting, tweeting, texting or blogging about it in a public manner. Making internal information public is not your job.

WHAT DETERMINES IF INTERNAL INFORMATION IS PUBLIC?

If you haven't received a press release or an announcement email from a member of the senior management team about the internal item in question, it is likely not public.

CAN I PUBLICLY DISPUTE A POSITION THAT Calaveras County Fairgrounds HAS TAKEN ON AN ISSUE?

All employees, participants and or volunteers will avoid publicly disputing a position that Calaveras County Fairgrounds has publicly taken on any issue. Publicly includes all social media sites, blogs and websites; as well as television and radio. We strive to portray an image of unity and objectivity and it is your job to help us maintain that image.

CAN I BE INVOLVED IN SOCIAL MEDIA SITES IN MY PERSONAL LIFE?

Of course, all employees/participants are welcome to use personal social media accounts; however, your affiliation with the company may only be listed in the appropriate place. For example, on Facebook and LinkedIn the appropriate place to list your affiliation with our company is under the "employers" section. All titles, descriptions and employment dates must be accurate. On Twitter, you can list your affiliation with Calaveras County Fairgrounds in the "about me" section if you choose. Photos of Animals, Supplies or Owners information is not appropriate. **All photos will be vetted and posted on the Calaveras County Fair's website and or social media by the office.**

WHY SHOULD I CARE ABOUT ALL OF THIS?

Adhering to this policy is important because Calaveras County Fairgrounds takes no legal responsibility for anything you post on a personal social media account. However, the DAA will hold all participants accountable to conducting themselves in a professional manner at all times. Should a participant breach this policy it is up to their supervisor to determine consequence for the inappropriate action.
